Trade News Highlights- January 2017

1. Infosys, Tata Hit by U.S. Proposal to Restrict Skilled Visas

A bill being proposed in U.S. Congress aimed at limiting the outsourcing of jobs and reform the country's high-skilled immigration program is weighing on Indian IT consulting and software stocks. Tata Consultancy Services Ltd. fell as much as 3.3 percent, the most since Nov. 9, while Infosys Ltd. shares fell as much as 2.8 percent to their lowest intraday price since Dec. 12. Tech Mahindra Ltd. fell 4.5 percent. The Sensex Index was mostly unchanged. The bill is designed to make it harder for companies in the U.S. to bring in skilled workers from abroad to fill high-tech jobs.

2. Business yatra: 'Mentor-on-Road' now goes to America!

After crisscrossing India as "Mentor-on-Road" to encourage entrepreneurship, leading trade and management consultant Jagat Shah, will now embark on a similar journey in the USA in June 2017. Supported by the US Commercial Services (USCS), US Department of Commerce and US-India Importers' Council (USIIC), the Ahmedabad-based consultant, seen as close to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, will undertake the 15,400-km, 78-day-long drive across America.

3. Last 2 years marked the best in US-India relation: Richard Verma

The last two years have marked the best in the Indo-US relationship when President Barack Obama and Prime Minister Narendra Modi met nine times and several initiative were undertaken, US Ambassador Richard Verma said on Friday. He said his country strongly condemns repeated incursions and infiltrations by Pakistan-backed terrorist groups into India.

4. U.S.-India Partnership: BIS Establishes Licensing Policy of General Approval, Expands Validated End-User Program

On January 19, 2017, the Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) published new regulations that establish a licensing policy of general approval for exports or re-exports to, or transfers within, India for most military, satellite and other items subject to the Export Administration Regulations (EAR) that do not involve weapons of mass destruction. Specifically, the items at issue in the new policy are those that are controlled for "National Security" or "Regional Stability" reasons only, which include most "600 series" military items and most satellite items. Additionally, BIS has significantly expanded the scope of potential license-free exports, re-exports and transfers of items to India by allowing military end uses for the first time under the Validated End-User (VEU) program, in addition to civil end uses.
